Top Tips

The following competitions are meant to support and encourage students to become independent learners and develop your interests outside of the classroom. You can check with your teachers and discuss with teachers, parents and friends about your ideas, but make sure that you are always expressing your ideas and that you have researched your arguments. The following are a list of points to consider. You will have to look in detail at what each competition's requirements are. Examples can be found on the web pages/links given.

- Understand the Topic Fully Before starting, ensure you have a clear understanding of the essay prompt. Research any unfamiliar terms or concepts and make sure you're addressing exactly what's being asked.
- 2. **Plan Your Essay Structure** Organize your thoughts before writing. Start with a strong introduction that outlines your argument, followed by well-structured body paragraphs, and end with a compelling conclusion. A clear structure helps keep your essay focused and coherent.
- 3. **Craft a Strong Thesis Statement** Your thesis should present your main argument clearly and concisely. Everything in your essay should support or relate back to this central point.
- 4. **Do Thorough Research** Gather reliable sources to support your argument. Use a mix of primary and secondary sources, and make sure you properly cite them. This shows you've engaged with the topic in-depth and enhances the credibility of your work.
- 5. Write with Clarity and Precision Avoid overly complex or vague language. Express your ideas clearly and precisely, making sure each sentence contributes to your argument. Remember, quality over quantity!
- 6. **Be Critical and Analytical** Don't just describe facts or summarize existing views. Engage critically with the material, analysing different perspectives and making connections between ideas. Show your ability to think deeply and independently.
- 7. **Stay Relevant and Focused** Stick to the point and avoid tangents. Every paragraph should directly relate to your thesis and help advance your argument.
- 8. **Use a Formal but Engaging Tone** Depending on the competition, aim for a formal academic tone, but don't be afraid to make your essay engaging and interesting to read. A well-written essay will stand out for both its content and style.
- 9. **Proofread and Edit** After you finish your first draft, take time to revise it. Look for grammar mistakes, unclear sentences, or areas where your argument could be stronger. Consider asking someone else to read it for feedback.
- 10. Practice Writing Regularly The more you write, the better you'll get. Regularly participate in practice competitions or write essays on different topics to improve your writing skills and boost your confidence.

On this page you will find details about the structure of the competition, the background on the five challenges and the judging criteria.




